About Go Native U

Go Native U at Westchester Community College is a joint project of the College's Division of Workforce Development and Community Education (WDCE) and The Native Plant Center. The non-credit courses teach students how to grow and maintain a beautiful and sustainable landscape using plants native to the Northeast. Classes are taught by leading experts and are designed to benefit industry professionals as well as home gardeners. Students may register for individual courses or enroll in the certificate program.

Certificate in Sustainable Gardening with Native Plants

The certificate comprises 50 contact hours: 18 hours of core courses, 17 hours of electives, and 15 hours of volunteer service. A final exam must also be passed to receive a certificate. The program offers participants an understanding of regional ecology and sustainable practices that will serve to guide gardening, landscape design, grounds management, and plant selection. Students may take as long as needed to fulfill the program.

Volunteer Service

Students pursuing a certificate can begin earning volunteer service hours at The Native Plant Center at any time. Opportunities include event assistance as well as garden maintenance and are geared to continuing the student's education with hands-on opportunities working with native plants. Audit Form

After completing coursework and volunteer service, certificate candidates must fill out the audit form and forward it to the Community Education office: Westchester Community College, Administration Building, Room 207, 75 Grasslands Road, Valhalla, NY 10595, or e-mail ashlee.pierce@sunywcc.edu. Upon a determination that all the requirements have been met, the student will be sent the final exam.

Final Exam

The final exam is a take-home test based on the content of the core courses. This is the last component of the certificate program. The exam will be e-mailed to the student, who should return the completed exam to Carolyn Summers, csummers@springmail.com. A successful grade will complete the certificate, which will be issued within 7–10 business days.
